We could only think perhaps of the funeral of a spouse so if anyone reads it and can think of any other appropriate place to read some of these verses we'd be delighted if you'd let us know.

Words to Make You Think



'May is the month of expectation, the month of wishes, the month of hope'

Recently, I came across this quote by Emily Bronte. It is thought that Emily Bronte's quote was about the changing season and the way nature is reborn in May. This got me thinking about what happens in May. It was my mum's favourite month. The joy of things to come. Days are getting longer. More sunshine. Holidays. Flowers blooming. The ascension of Jesus into heaven which I share with you.

In John 14 there was an **EXPECTATION** from Jesus said when He spoke to his disciples: 'If you love me, you will do as I command. ¹⁶ Then I will ask the Father to send you the Holy Spirit who will help^b you and always be with you. ¹⁷ The Spirit will show you what is true. The people of this world cannot accept the Spirit, because they don't see or know him. But you know the Spirit, who is with you and will keep on living in you.'

Jesus goes on to say His **WISHES** 'If anyone loves me, they will obey me. Then my Father will love them, and we will come to them and live in them. ²⁴ But anyone who doesn't love me, won't obey me. What they have heard me say doesn't really come from me, but from the Father who sent me.

Finally, He speaks of **HOPE**^{• 26} But the Holy Spirit will come and help you, because the Father will send the Spirit to take my place. The Spirit will teach you everything and will remind you of what I said while I was with you.²⁷ I give you peace, the kind of peace only I can give. It isn't like the peace this world can give. So don't be worried or afraid.'
