In the beauty of the autumn colours with the sunshine glistening through the changing leaves, (or maybe the raindrops splashing in the puddles!), we remember the goodness of our Creator, and the many good gifts to us through the abundance of his creation.

### A Time for Giving Thanks

We pray 'give us today our daily bread', and he gives us not just bread, but our treats of chocolate, coffee, sugar, and all that we can make with them! Our lives are enriched by many good gifts of home and family, warmth and comfort, beauty and enjoyment, as well as the necessities of food and shelter.

### A Time for Reflection

How often do we stop to think how many countries the food on our plates comes from? We can eat lamb from New Zealand, green beans from Kenya, chocolate from Ivory Coast... People across the world plant, harvest, process and transport the food we buy right here in Droylsden. There are a number of schemes that can help us to buy food wisely: the Fair Trade scheme works with suppliers and farmers in developing countries to defend the rights of workers, ensuring fair pay, community development and environmental care; Rainforest Alliance works with farmers to protect forests and prevent child labour; the Roundtable on Sustainable Palm Oil certifies oil produced from sustainable plantations (their website says that palm oil is in half of all supermarket products –

from biscuits and chocolate to soap and toothpaste.) As we give thanks for God's goodness, let's also do all we can to promote a fairer world through the products we buy and the food we put on our tables.

### Samaritan's Purse

Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse. It is a hands-on way for you to bless children in need across the world by filling shoeboxes with toys, personal care items, school supplies, and fun gifts.

The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world. Through this project, Samaritan's Purse partners with the local church worldwide to share the Good News of Jesus Christ and make disciples of the nations

After receiving a shoebox gift, children have the opportunity to enrol in The Greatest Journey - 12 fun and interactive Bible lessons, where they get the chance to discover who Jesus is and how to begin their own journey of faith.

Every shoebox gift delivered by Operation Christmas Child is a tangible expression of God's amazing love. But a shoebox is just the beginning. It also presents an opportunity in more than 100 countries for our church partners to invite children into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ through The Greatest Journey.

The goal of the programme is for children to become faithful followers of Jesus Christ in their daily lives as they share Him with family and friends. And it all starts by training local teachers who love kids and are passionate about making disciples. More than 35.4 million children have enrolled in The Greatest Journey since 2009.

After completing The Greatest Journey, children attend a graduation celebration and receive a certificate. Most importantly, they are given a Bible that includes the New Testament in their own language. Complete with illustrations, it is often the first copy of God's Word the child, or their family, will own. After seeing the transformation in the students, their loved ones' hearts are open to hearing the Good News for themselves.

Prayer is a vital part of our ministry and an easy way to get involved with

what we do. Our offices around the world meet daily to pray for our projects and partners globally. Will you join us in praying for the work of Samaritan's Purse and our Church Partners worldwide?

Please pray for OCC UK, volunteers and staff, that we would be of one vision and that we would give God the glory for all that we do in and through the ministry of OCC.

Pray that they will grow in relationship with one another, that there will be a spirit of unity across all teams.
