Our work: An introduction to Christian Blind Mission

"Out of their gloom and darkness, the eyes of the blind shall see." – Isaiah 29:18

Cathleen's story

Living with sight-loss because of cataracts in both eyes, three-year old Cathleen grew more and more frustrated. Her mother, Frimina, worried she would not have the same opportunities as her friends as she grows older. She couldn't see traffic or even distinguish her mother's face.

But thanks to the incredible generosity of Christian Blind Mission supporters like you, Cathleen has now been able to receive cataract surgery. Frimina took her daughter to our partner, the Kilimanjaro Christian Medical Centre in Tanzania, East Africa, where ophthalmologist Dr. Godfrey Furahini diagnosed Cathleen and referred her for surgery.

The doctors carefully replaced Cathleen's lenses with artificial ones, managing to operate on both eyes in a two-hour operation. Just a few hours later Cathleen was wide awake and happy, even though her eyes were still covered with bandages. She sat on her bed and sang "Hallelujah" again and again.

Cathleen took a sight test using a Snellen chart, and it showed "a huge improvement" according to Dr. Furahini, who said, "She could only see the biggest letter on the chart before. Now she can see even the letters in the fourth line. This is a good sign that her vision will improve even more in the next weeks."

When the mother and daughter returned home, Frimina told us: "I am more than happy. And I am proud that she was so brave. Cathleen pointed to an airplane in the sky on our way home and asked me what it is. Now she wants to become a pilot."

Our achievements:

- Reached 5.2 million people in 29 countries across Africa, Asia and Latin America
- Treated over 3.1 million people Carried out 111,107 Reached 5.2 million people in 29 countries across Africa, Asia and Latin America
- Trained 16,603 doctors, nurses and other health professionals
- Carried out 111,107 sight-restoring cataract surgeries
- 3.1 million people for blinding and disabling diseases protected from blinding diseases like trachoma or river blindness

- 1,404,838 people received eye health services 1
- 53,540 glasses and low vision devices distributed

Let us pray... Lord, God, champion of the poor, protector and healer of those who cannot see, or hear or walk. Give us your eyes to see, we pray that we might look with compassion and love on all your children. May our eyes not be distracted by empty things but be set on Jesus. Give us a vision of your kingdom and give us wisdom to know how we can work towards that together, guided by your Holy Spirit. Amen.


